Salt began back in 1990 when poet John Kinsella launched Salt Magazine in Australia, where it quickly gained an international reputation as a leading publisher of new poetry and poetics and it has continued to grow ever since. Salt is a member of the Independent Publishers Guild and is based in Cambridge, UK where they publish more than 80 books each year. Their publishing programme focuses principally on poetry with a complementary output of biography, critical companions, essays and literary criticism by authors from the UK, the USA, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, the Caribbean and mainland Europe. Their list includes many internationally acclaimed authors, including major works by leading British poets John James, Tony Lopez, Peter Robinson and John Wilkinson, landmark titles by American poets Charles Bernstein, Maxine Chernoff, Forrest Gander, Peter Gizzi, Paul Hoover, Ron Silliman and Susan Wheeler, and new work by prize-winning Australian authors Pam Brown, Jill Jones, Kate Lilley, Peter Rose, Tom Shapcott and John Tranter.

Salt author Emily Benet has already won the *Author Blog Award 2010*, Nuala Ní Chonchúir has been short-listed for the *2010 Edge Hill Short Story Prize* and Jasmine Donahaye and Richard Marggraf Turley were both long-listed for this year's *Wales Book of the Year*. Salt's authors continue to receive major critical attention making their titles a dynamic addition to the dawsonera catalogue.
